Corporation – Election of Board of Directors and Officers

A quorum was lacking at the scheduled January 24 elections, and the snow storm wiped out the rescheduled date of February 7. The regular council business meeting of February 8 was suspended, and a special meeting for corporate elections took place, chaired by Mike Petrilli, the 2016 corporation president. At this meeting, there were 16 candidates who had been named or previously accepted a call to be nominated for the board of directors (BOD). After asking from the floor three times for any other nominations to the board of directors, and hearing none, Mike declared the nominations closed. Since only 14 BOD positions were open (the GK is automatically a BOD member), two proposed candidates withdrew their name from the ballot. With 14 names and 14 positions, a motion was made to cast one ballot for that slate of candidates. This was seconded and the slate of BOD passed unanimously.

In similar fashion, the President, Vice President, Treasurer, and Secretary were each proposed from the newly elected BOD, no additional names were nominated from the BOD, and then each officer was also elected unanimously by motion.

Delbert F. Downing age 85 of Salem, NH, died at Salemhaven Nursing Home, Salem, NH. Mr. Downing was born in Malden, MA, where he grew up and was educated. He was a resident of Salem, NH for over 60 years.



Mr. Downing was the retired Director for Water Resources for the State of NH. He served as a NH State Senator from 1970-1978, where he was Democratic Leader, Chairman of the Ways and Means Committee and a Military Aide for Governor Hugh Gallen. He served on the Salem, NH Housing Authority for 25 years and he served on the Salem school board. He was a member of St. Joseph and Saint Matthew Parish. He was a member of the Knights of Columbus, 4th degree in Salem, the DAV, and a Life member of the the Ancient and Honorable Artillery Company in Massachusetts and the Salem Elks. He was very active in town politics and served on many Salem, NH boards. He enjoyed politics, dancing, and traveling.

He was predeceased by his son High Sherriff Michael Downing and his grandson Sean T. Bryant. He is survived by his beloved wife Teresa (Crimlisk) Downing of Salem, NH. They were married for over 63 years.

Culture of Life - Rosary and Mass

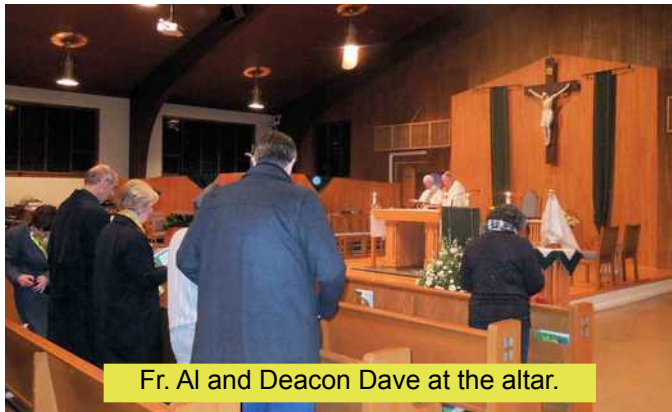


Dennis Groulx organized our annual Culture of Life night on Friday, January 20, at Mary, Queen of Peace Church. Attendance was

Where did the money go? - GK update



St. Joseph Church AED

Our council donated to our Parish money for two projects. One was to install an AED device at St. Joseph Church. (There is already an AED at Mary, Queen of Peace Church.) It was a good idea to add this life-saving machine to St. Joe Church, especially considering how many old Knights attend Mass there! The AED device is now waiting for your need (and we pray it never has to be used!); it is installed on the rear wall of the church, near the stairs to the choir loft.

And, we donated money for the food pantry. I delivered the check to the office finance manager, Carol Kater, just as she was discussing the need in the food pantry to have a refrigerator and freezer. The food pantry manager, Kellie Lavoie, wife of Brother Paul Lavoie, discovered that if she had a place to properly store “cold” items, then our food pantry would be eligible to

receive, at a great discount, milk, butter, meats, fresh fruit, and so forth. This would increase the food we could give out, and would greatly round out the meals that were now limited to boxes and cans with healthy servings of fresh foods. But there was no money to purchase a big enough refrigerator and freezer units.

I suggested “Here’s a check right now! Go buy the units!” “Could we do that? Your check was for food?” I made the GK decision... “With this check and buying the cold storage units, you will get in more food and healthy food and thus increase the quality of the food pantry. It’s a no brainer!” [The GK is good at no-brain solutions, being properly equipped.]
