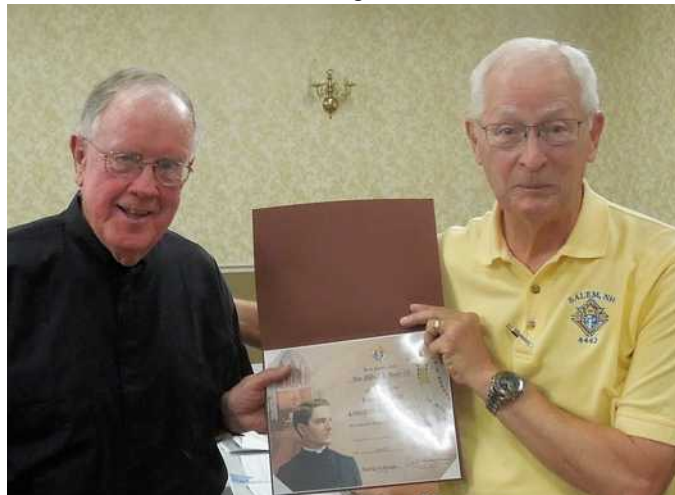
Treasurer and Financial Reports

- 3) Membership has and will always be the driving force for the order and this past year you were able to recruit 8 new members. Congratulations. We would like to encourage continued efforts in recruitment and would like to see every council conduct a membership drive within each parish this fall and I offer all my assistance and support within that area if needed.
- 4) State Programs
- 5) Summer Quarterly meeting is Sunday, July 24, 2016 at St Mathews Church; Windham, NH. Lunch is \$8 and will be served between 12:00 to 1:00pm. The meeting will run from 1:00pm to 4:00 pm. There is a woman's program slated for the meeting so that wives are urged to attend.
- 6) I would like to ask for your continuing prayers for Fr. Smolley as he continues his struggles in rehab. I have been told that there is a very good possibility that he will be released from rehab within the coming weeks. I also have info that the State K of C Retreat weekend is being rescheduled again this year. It will be at Camp Bernadette on September 23 to 25, 2016. Angel Flight is a group of volunteer pilots who fly, mostly at their own cost, sick children to distant treatment centers. For example, a child might be needing a kidney transplant, and the child lives on Nantucket. A flight is needed to get her to a hospital in Boston, and the flight is "must go now." The video was very touching, showing the personal bond that builds between the family and the volunteer pilot.

The costs for flying a plane are quite high; our council could consider giving a larger contribution next year. (*Angel Flight, Northeast according to a charity watch group is rated highly, with 89% of all contributions going directly to the program. Only 11% is spend on administration and fund raising. - ed*)

Fundraising Numbers - Net Total: \$4,947.00

- Primary Raffle: qty.92 \$20 tickets sold (15 purchased by KofC Council 4442). \$1840 sales, minus \$1,000 cost of ticket purchase. Net \$840.00
- Secondary Raffle & Food: Sales totaled \$750.00. After expenses net \$123.29
- Pauline and Pamela Gorgol: Personal fundraising for the KofC team totaling \$1,080.00
- Online fund-raising through the RFL website (\$500 KofC4442 donation, \$1,000 Kiwanis donation, Mike Banks raised \$695, other donations) totaling \$2,702

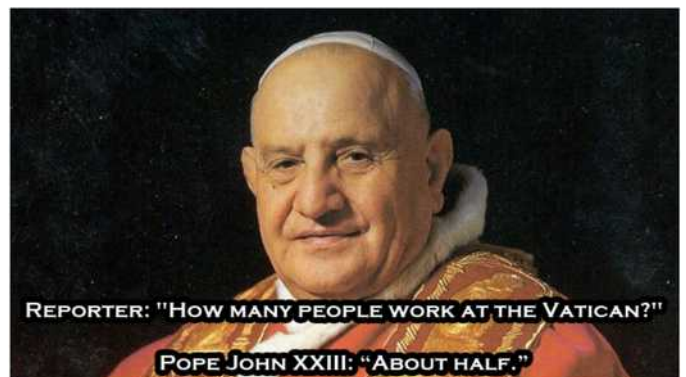
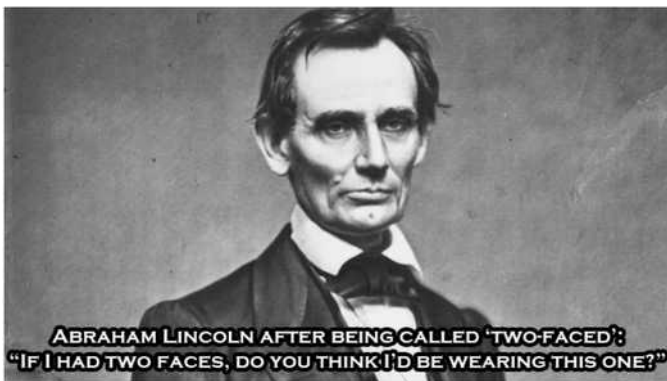
