Chaplain's Message

7:33PM Joy of the Gospel – as you know, the Pope calls this his program. Knights want to be with the program. Discussed aligning the Knights with the Parish. Pope Francis and his vision for our catholic parishes throughout the world. Appreciate the Knights support of the Parish, fits perfectly to what Pope Francis says. Pope Francis says – “I dream of a missionary impulse in the church capable of transforming everything”. Fr Tom has heard that Knights have noted issues in the world – but energy should be used to “transform everything”. 
Bingo - Ron Bourque

Texas Hold-em - Larry Belair

8:11PM Last event coming up – “The Rock” is shutting down August 30th for good. Land was sold to Joe Faro; deed stipulates no gambling “forever” on the land. Over 10 years raised over \$500,000 for KofC. Larry provided the financial secretary with a check for \$4,800 for the last event. Charities and groups are looking for new venue in Salem to keep Texas Hold'em going, let Larry know if you know of a location. *(The closing is a loss of \$2.1 Million in revenue to about 36 charities in Salem; it also is loss of revenue to the state. On personal note, Larry gave amazing news of how wife Verna was treated and now almost fully recovered from her stroke. Also gave personal advice: write down your medications for you and wife; in time of emergency when seconds count, don't let panic cause a brain freeze and delay treatment.

Larry also presented to the council a gift from the Salem Boys & Girls Club, from their charity auction. A stuffed monkey was given to us in thanks for our “starter” auction contribution, which got the event going. The Club started the action by showing this large monkey at the event, and announcing that our KofC Council has donated \$5,000. There were other smaller monkeys on the auction table. “For a donation of \$500 you can get this size monkey... For \$100 you get this smaller monkey.” The bidders got into the fun, and eventually more than \$25,000 was raised. Our gift was multiplied!




