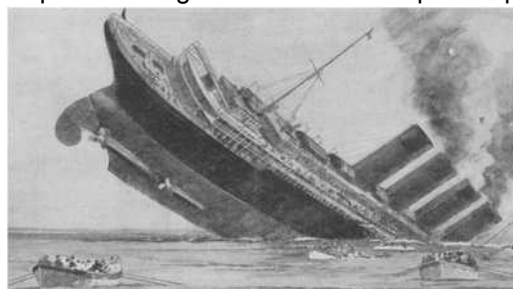

Remembering a Deceased Member: Roland H. Hamel
