Old Business

The April Notice of Motion of the proposed council by-laws was removed from the table. Discussion summary by GK Paul St.Amand: The by-laws were emailed to members on April 17. Only one comment was received back. The proposed by-laws are from a template by Supreme. A review (by Paul St.Amand, Larry Belair, Alan Phair, Gene Bryant, Don Simmons, Bill Richards, Dick Collopy, Charlie Walsh, and Bob Fournier) concluded that the template is "plain vanilla" and is acceptable to approve. The question was called and the by-laws were approved unanimously. (The by-laws can be [downloaded from the council web site.](#)) *(Subsequent to the meeting, the by-laws were submitted and approved by Supreme. -GK)*

As the current Grand Knight, I have created a "Council Policies" document as suggested by Supreme. The policy document describes what we now do that varies from unchangeable template by-laws. (For example, we hold a deceased members mass in May; the Supreme template says a mass is done in November. ... but our service includes a visit to the cemetery, better done in spring than winter.) Also, the policy states that the GK has authorization to expend up to \$500 in cases of in-between meeting emergencies. This amount was suggested by the trustees and the FS and Treasurer. At this meeting, the membership raised no objection. The policies document is also at the same web location.

New Business

The following were presented by the trustees and voted upon and all were approved:

- Dick Collopy requested \$100 for deceased members' luncheon.
- Angel Flight of NE requested \$250
- The 9/11 Never Forget Memorial \$500
- Deceased Knights Flower Memorial \$100 for Dave Thompson and crew.
- Rockingham Church Salem Fest 5K \$100
- Bill Richards for snacks after the 5th Rosary service on May 31. (This will be part of recruitment activity.)
- Bob McQuinn - \$200 for his Jimmy Fund Walk. (Bob requested \$100, but the members increased this worthy cause to \$200.)
- The GK reported an emergency expenditure of \$350 to pay for convention meals for our "Family of the Year."

Discussion was made about the parish buying a leaf blower and power trimmers for St. Joseph, to allow volunteers to work the area without competing for the existing gear at MQP. After discussion, we realize that there is a line item in our council budget for "Parish Capital Expenses" so no extra funds are needed. This did not need a vote.

Lecturer Report: Ron Bourque

A sailing buddy recently sent me this video. It's hilarious! It is a parody of what a four-year-old's first day in a pre-Vatican II Catholic school in Ireland could be like, showing how hard some of our Christian truths are to accept on first exposure. Please take five minutes and view this, then read the discussion below:

Did you ever think about these truths that way? Take the Trinity for instance: three Persons in one God. One equals three and three equals one. Our entire system of mathematics declares this to be an absolute impossibility, but with God, all things are possible.

Or how about the virgin birth? How can a woman conceive a child without having relations with a man, thus remaining a virgin, and give birth, and remain a virgin her whole life?

Every time we go to Communion, we receive the most Sacred Body and most Precious Blood of our Lord Jesus! Almighty God gives us a piece of His very self. Yet, if we taste an unconsecrated host and then a consecrated one, we will discern no difference in taste. So too with the wine that becomes the Precious Blood. How do we know this is real?

In 836 in Lanciano, Italy, a priest was celebrating Mass while doubting this miracle known as transubstantiation. As he said the words, "This is my body," the then consecrated host in his hands started to bleed, and it's been bleeding ever since! Years ago, a medical team examined the host and determined the "flesh" was from a human heart. They were even able to determine Our Lord's blood type!

Later in 1263, in Bolsena, another Italian town, another priest was saying Mass and doubted, and that host has also been bleeding ever since. In fact, this miracle has been repeated in places like Poland, Venezuela, even in Worcester, Massachusetts! (If you'd like more information, just Google "bleeding host," and a number of sites will come up.)

Even so, if you visit Lanciano, Bolsena or even Worcester, you'll find many non-believers despite the incredible miracles in their midst. Why can't they believe what many of us take for granted? The answer is something called faith, and it's a gift from God. Our Lord said, "No one can come to me unless the Father draws him." St. Paul said our beliefs are ridiculous to non-believers, and so they are. Just ask a few of them. Maybe the reason our churches have become empty is so many people have lost their faith. Parking lot attendants, greeters at church, and free coffee and donuts after Mass won't bring them back. Until we find a way to restore their faith, they're not coming back.

I've played a role in bringing several people back. It's a very humbling experience. After several futile attempts, I began to realize that unless God pushes the faith button, I'm wasting my time. When He does push it, it makes no difference what I do, as long as I get out of the way. I've given speeches in 12 foreign countries and all over the U.S. I know how to persuade people to improve their operations, but I don't know how to convince anyone that a little wafer is the Body of Our Lord Jesus Christ. I may be able to start a conversation, but unless He gives the person faith, it's not going to work.

We've been hearing a lot about this "new evangelization," where we're supposed to bring people back. If we want to help bring someone back, the most important thing we can do is pray for them. The sailing buddy, who sent me the link to this video, is a fallen-away Catholic I've been working on for over 25 years, and I haven't given up. Sometimes it takes a while... Vivat Jesus!

Passing of Sir Knight Paul D. Elmore

Paul D. Elmore, 73, of Londonderry, NH passed away peacefully on Tuesday, May 9, 2017 at the Bedford Hills Nursing Home in Bedford, NH. He was born on August 3, 1943 in Summit, NJ, a son of the late Duane and Helen Elmore.



A devoted husband, father, grandfather and brother, Paul lived a life of service, earning the Bronze Star for his U.S. Army service in Vietnam and remaining active as a civilian in both his church and his community. His faith was important to him, and he was proud to serve as a Lector and Eucharistic Minister at St. Matthew Parish in Windham, NH and to have an active role with the Knights of Columbus, where he led Council 7572 as Grand Knight from 1995 to 1997. An avid baseball fan, Paul was honored in 1997 for his 10+ years of work with Salem Youth Baseball, and in 1999, he was honored as Big Brother of the Year by the Big Brothers and Big Sisters. Additionally, following his career as a computer programmer analyst, he volunteered at the Shepherd's Pantry in Windham. In later years, Paul's health suffered, but his wish to be of service did not. Even very shortly before his passing, he was honored for leading the rosary at his nursing home.

Paul comes from, and is survived by, a large family, including his wife of 44 years, Susan Elmore of Londonderry, his daughter, Julie Elmore of Ayer, MA, and his son and daughter-in-law, John Elmore and Xiaohui Zeng-Elmore of Stratham, NH, whose two boys, Edward Elmore and Brian Elmore, made him a proud grandfather. Paul is also survived by four siblings, Dorothy Manganaro of Hingham, MA, Roberta Dyer of Lawton, OK, Steven Elmore of Saline, MI, and Rosemary Hames of Quincy, MA, a large extended family, and many good friends.

Calling hours will be held on Tuesday, May 16, 2017 from 6-8 pm at the Peabody Funeral Home and Crematorium, 15 Birch Street, Derry, NH. A Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated on Wednesday, May 17, 2017 at 10 am at St. Matthew Parish, 2 Searles Road, Windham with cremation to follow.
